The will of Sir George Alexander Touche of Broomfield (as reported in the Dorking Advertiser on 9 August 1935) included

£500 each to his gardener William Holles Etheridge and his personal servant Alfred Robert Wakefield who had worked for him for 27 and 24 years respectively. £250 to his chauffeur William Harvey, six months wages to each other man and boy in permanent service and one months wages for each year of service or 6 months wages to each female servant.

An annuity of £65 to Howard(?) Walker widow of his late gardener

£50 each to Terence Norton and Nancy Griffiths of 125 Victoria Street SW in remembrance of their ever cheerful greeting
